Dear participant,

Thank you for registering for the 10th EuroGames in Utrecht. As you probably know, this tournament will be organized by Smashing Pink Amsterdam. We are very proud on the high number of registrations and to welcome you as one of the 250 participants from 15 countries: Belgium, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, France, Germany, Italy, Hungary, Denmark, Spain, Switzerland, South Africa, UK, USA and the Netherlands.

Please take note of the items below.

1. Draws and Schedule

Every player has been crosschecked during the registration process before in order to enter each participant in the appropriate division. For the seeding we used the GLTA ranking list per May 1st 2005. The seeding committee used also their discretion to take recent results in account (such as the Amsterdam PINKster tournament).

ALL draws will host a consolation round. All consolation matches will be played in a pro-set (8 games and tie-break on 8-8). Certain doubles events will be played in round robins. After loosing the first match you will be scheduled for the consolation round automatically. If you don't want to participate in the consolation round please inform the desk. Only then we are able to inform your opponent. (For doubles events: you can't play the consolation matches with another partner then in your first match in the main draw.)

The draws might be changed in the days to come, therefore you can not claim any rights from this publication. The time schedule will be uploaded several days prior to the tournament. The definite schedule will be announced at the draw party (see below).

Each player must be present 30 minutes before your match at the correct venue.

Please understand that due to the huge number of players, the tight schedule and the fact that we play at two venues we want to prevent all delay.

2. Accreditation - Draw party – Miet en Griet

All participants of the EuroGames need to be accredited prior to take part in the competitions. The central EuroGames organization will inform you separately about the accreditation in the Royal Jaarbeurs Centre.

De tennis schedule will NOT be available at the accreditation, but will be given out in a special draw party on Wednesday June 15th. This draw party (in dutch: Miet & Griet) will be in café BodyTalk (www.bodytalk.nl), Oudegracht 64, Utrecht (see map below) from 8.00 pm (20.00) till 10.00 pm (22.00).

Only participants with a valid player pass (accreditation !!) for Tennis or Field Hockey will have access to BodyTalk. Due to the size of this café we can't host other sport participants and/or family, friends, partners without a valid pass.

During the Miet & Griet you will receive the definite times of your first matches.

This is also a good opportunity to meet your opponents, your doubles partner or to see your old friends.

BUT: first go to Accreditation in the Jaarbeurs Centre and then to BodyTalk !!!

3. Tennis Venues

All matches will be played on the clay outdoor courts of tennis centre Domstad and Heidehal Nieuwegein. The Open, A, B division play Thursday and Friday at Heidehal Nieuwegein (HEI). The C and D division play at Domstad (DOM). From Friday 5.00 pm on all matches will be at Domstad.

The tennis centre has good locker room and shower facilities. First Aid and Sport Massage will be available for tournament participants. Both canteens are well equipped in drinks and food. The canteens offer also lunches and dinners.

4. Directions to the venues.
